
Timor-Leste COVID-19 Survey













This factsheet presents the results of a **telephone survey** of 534 **Timor-Leste adults** conducted from **19 September to 3 October**. During September, there was **only one** active COVID-19 case in Timor-Leste, and government support payments had been distributed to most households. Results from **September** are compared with the May/July results.



Food security was less of an issue in September than in May









Television is still most trusted for news about:

COVID-19 (77%) July: 85%, May: 81% Other news (78%) July: 81%, May: 76%

More are watching: GMN (86%) July: 81% May: 67%



More moderate numbers trust radio for: COVID-19 (12%) July: 5%, May: 12% Other news (8%) July: 6%, May: 17% More are listening to: **Community radio (42%)** July: 19% May: 13%

Those in Dili (compared to outside of Dili):

- Trust television for COVID news (91% vs 71%)
- Needs less information about accessing government support (21% vs 27%)
